The Board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners, Tuscarawas County, Ohio met in regular session on Thursday, July 24, 2014, with the following members present: Chris Abbuhl, Kerry Metzger, and Belle Everett.

Commissioner Metzger moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, R.C. 5553.04 provides that when the Board of County Commissioners is of the opinion that it will be for the public convenience or welfare to locate, establish, alter, widen, straighten, vacate, or change the direction of a public road, it shall so declare by resolution, which resolution shall set forth the general route and termini of the road, or part of the road, to be located, established, or vacated, or the general manner in which the road is to be altered, widened, or straightened, or the direction of the road is to be changed.

WHEREAS, a request was filed with the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners on 7/3/2014, by Joseph S. Bachman, Tuscarawas County Engineer, regarding the vacation and relocation of a right-of-way for County Road 103 (North Orchard Road) in Lawrence Township; the request and reasons underlying the request are set forth in Exhibit "A" attached, a 7/2/2014 letter from Joseph S. Bachman, Tuscarawas County Engineer; Exhibit "B" attached contains a description of the right-of-way limits of the dedicated portion of relocated Tuscarawas County Road 103 (North Orchard Road) and Exhibit "C" is a description of the existing center line of the vacated portion of County Road 103 (North Orchard Road);

WHEREAS, in accordance with R.C. 5553.04 through 5553.11, the Board of Commissioners accepts the request for the vacation and relocation of the right-of-way for County Road 103 (North Orchard Road) and sets the date for a view in connection with the request for **August 12, 2014 at 10:00 a.m.**, meeting at the site of the vacation/relocation and further sets the date for a final hearing for **September 8, 2014 at 2:00 p.m.**, to be held in the office of the Tuscarawas County Commissioners; the Clerk of the Board shall give notice of the time and place for both the view and hearing by publishing an appropriate notice in *The Times-Reporter* once a week for two consecutive weeks which shall include a brief statement of the character of the requested improvement. Additionally, the Clerk under R.C. 5553.05(B) shall

send written notice of the final hearing by first class mail at least twenty (20) days before the date of the final public hearing to the owners of the properties abutting upon the portion of the road to be vacated, together with the Director of the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. These notices shall be mailed to the addresses of such owners appearing on the County Auditor's current tax list;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners that the Board accepts the above-mentioned request of the Tuscarawas County Engineer and officially sets the dates and times noted above for the view and final hearing on the requested vacation/relocation of the right-of-way as petitioned.

Discussion: Lee Montgomery of AFGA (American Federation of Government Employees) was present to discuss stopping Vision 2025. There has been a lot going on in Congress regarding downsizing the Social Security offices. She thought it would be a good idea to support our local Social Security office. She is an employee of the local Social Security office and she is not trying to save her job. She is eligible for retirement in four years. Vision 2025 does not affect her directly. It may affect her later down the road when she wants community based services. Vision 2025 came about when the Social Security Agency hired an agency called NAPA (National Academy of Public Administration) to look at options to help cut their budget. NAPA is staffed by people at IBM and big corporate companies that did a study and came up with this plan. Social Security has been steadily closing Social Security offices. They have closed between 70 and 100 offices to date. Ohio has 58 Social Security offices. Forty-three million Americans visited field office in 2013. They are looking to close every office in the State of Ohio except four. They are referring everyone to the internet. They are asking employees to internet themselves right out of a job. Social Security has lost 11,000 employees since the budget cuts. Ms. Montgomery is a claims representative in the local Social Security office. They are concerned with the future of the jobs and employees of the Social Security field offices, but more for what it will do to the public. In local communities, the closing is a real detriment. There are people who cannot or will not have a clue how to use the internet. People such as the mentally challenged, aged, and people that don't own a computer or can't afford a computer will not have access. People have been directed to the library, but the library limits the time allowed on the computers. Filing for retirement benefits or disability is not a fast process. It could take as much as four hours. Librarians and people working at the libraries have no training or experience to help people fill out the forms online. The online process takes longer and is timelier than being able to visit a local field office and meet with someone face to face. Using the internet to get your benefit verification slows the process for folks that need assistance with housing, food stamps, and HEAP. These people are expected to wait 10 days to get it in the mail if they do it online. The 800 number provided for folks to call is just an answering service. They don't have the training or expertise to help people, so when people call there they are getting general guidelines telling them what to do. Ms. Montgomery thinks it's horrendous that they want to do away with the field offices in the name of the budget. Ms. Montgomery stated that there would be offices but there will be very limited service because there will only be four in the State and none will be close to here. Commissioner Everett stated that people will have to drive hundreds of miles to get face to face service, and that they have paid into Social Security all of their lives and they expect to get face to face service. Commissioner Everett questioned whether the NAPA people are trained as employees in field offices are? Ms. Montgomery stated that the NAPA people are not trained, that they are big-wig corporate people and they have no clue what Social Security and the intricacies and what it takes to file a claim. Every situation is different. The filing process

is very detailed and is not an easy process. With unemployment as high as it is, she does not want to see the Social Security office go away like the unemployment office did. Commissioner Abbuhl questioned if Ms. Montgomery had spoken with Senator Brown or Congressman Gibbs? She stated that their union has been all over but she has not spoken with them personally. Commissioner Abbuhl let her know that on occasion the Senator's office will schedule public work sessions and use our boardroom to hear constituent's concerns. He also offered to send her contact information for the Senator and Congressman so she can make personal contact with their offices. Commissioner Everett questioned how many employees there were at the New Philadelphia office and how many people they generally service. She stated that they now have ten, one of which is management, down from 22 and they have had as many as 300 people walk in for service, but the number does vary. People have paid into Social Security for years and they expect face to face service. They want a professional to sit down with them. Sometimes people visit the offices that are not ready to retire, they just want some financial planning and they can only get that in a field office. The 800 number is not able to provide that and people cannot always drive over 100 miles to meet with someone to figure out what they are going to do. Ms. Montgomery's biggest fear in this community is that Social Security is going to go away and then some folks will fall through the cracks because they don't have the necessary avenue to get their benefits. Social Security uses less than 1% of the budget for administration. She wanted to make the Commissioners aware of what Vision 2025 was and what it could mean to the community. The Commissioners appreciate Ms. Montgomery coming in and educating them on Vision 2025.

Commissioner Abbuhl called the meeting out of recess and back into Regular Session at 9:43a.m. for the purpose of the 9:45 a.m. appointment.

Discussion: Dee Grossman was here to present the Economic Impact Study of Tuscarawas County. Commissioner Abbuhl stated he was excited about the report and that Tourism is a great economic engine in Tuscarawas County. Every year the CVB does an Economic Impact Study with the State of Ohio. It is done by a company called Oxford Economics. In 2013 the economic impact and tourism in Tuscarawas County was \$378,599,600 compared to \$312 Million in 2012, making 2013 the best year we have ever had. Dee feels we will be hard pressed to hit 2013 numbers this year. It created 3,568 jobs which equals \$67 million in wages. There were \$46 million dollars in taxes collected. This in a nutshell is what the economic impact of travel and tourism means to Tuscarawas County. Commissioner Abbuhl stated that these tourism dollars equate to a raise in sales tax dollars. Local restaurants estimate that forty to fifty percent of their business is from locals, which is great, but that also means that fifty to sixty percent of their business is from people that are not local. Commissioner Abbuhl stated that it is exciting that we are seeing activity coming from the northern part of the state to Tuscarawas County. With the new concept of the Power of 32, we are looking at other areas of the state being able to connect into our trail system. Dee stated that tourism isn't just one thing; it's a combination of everything. Commissioner Abbuhl stated that Tuscarawas County has some fantastic attractions. Dee stated that we don't know how lucky we are, there are other counties that would kill to have half the attractions we have. Commissioner Everett questioned what the CVB is marketing, what are they doing differently, if they have increased marketing or done something different. Dee stated that the CVB does not sell a product, they sell their partners. The best way to increase visitation is to allow their partners to be better at what they do. Two years ago they started experiential tourism and developed a program that has cost almost \$100,000. It has given us a product, that is the same product, but it's a new way of looking at it. It gives the visitors a new experience. Commissioner Abbuhl asked Dee to expand and explain how the CVB offered grants to allow this training. Dee said the CVB income has been spectacular the last two years and they are offering the grants program as a way to give back and have expanded the program. It trains the attractions to offer the same thing but with a different view. The CVB operates Tuscarawas Valley Heritage which is their 501C3 and in the past they have given field trip money for schools to visit local attractions as well. Commissioner Abbuhl stated he would like to see the State of Ohio advertising more and marketing Ohio. Dee stated that the State is advertising outside of Ohio and that we have very good people in tourism positions for Ohio. Our number one sources of visitors are from Ohio. Commissioner Abbuhl stated that Tuscarawas County is a pretty special place and we have a lot to offer and we want to highlight what we have. Dee has done a great job of that with the dollars she has to work with. Commissioner Metzger asked what kind of feedback they got from the Director of Travel & Tourism of Ohio when they visited. Dee stated that they plan to come back due to the short time they had allotted here, but they were fascinated with the Depot. She also mentioned that the Governor's office was here as well. Dee feels it is not possible to see the whole county in three days; it takes time to visit all of our attractions that are offered. Commissioner Metzger questioned what direction Dee felt the Ohio Travel & Tourism is going. Dee feels the funding mechanism for the state is better but it still needs work, which is part of the problem, but the state will do the same things we are already doing. The Commissioners thanked Dee for coming in.
