Project will consist of furnishing all services, labor, materials and equipment necessary to perform work as per plans and specifications set forth by the Tuscarawas County Engineer. Specifically, the project will consist of repairing a landslide by driving HP 10 x 42 piling to refusal, or as directed, at 4 ft. spacing with 4' x 2' concrete lagging, deadman piles at 8' spacing with tieback roads, along with earthwork, road repairs, guardrail and all necessary appertaining work.

Bids shall be in conformity with the Ohio Revised Code, and shall be upon the forms furnished in the Contract Documents. Bids must be submitted in a sealed envelope, bearing on the outside, the name and address of the bidder and the name of the project, "PROJECT #5-2015 TUSCARAWAS COUNTY."

This project is funded in part with Ohio Public Works Commission Funds and is subject to funding agency requirements.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a bid guaranty in the form of (1) a certified check, cashier's check or irrevocable letter of credit pursuant to ORC 1305 equal to 10% for the bid; or (2) a bid guaranty and contract bond for the full amount of the bid;

both forms of guaranty as provided in Chapter 153 of the Ohio Revised Code and in the project specifications. **RESOLUTION (761-2015) SUPPORT OF EXPLORING OPTIONS-REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT**

It was moved by Commissioner Metzger, seconded by Commissioner Abbuhl, to approve the following resolution:

**WHEREAS**, the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners has been informed by the Stark County Commissioners that a need exists to make certain improvements to U.S. Route 30; and

**WHEREAS**, Revised Code Chapter 5595 authorizes the boards of two or more county board of commissioners to enter into a cooperative agreement creating a regional transportation improvement project (RTIP) to complete transportation improvements; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board believes that improvements to U.S. Route 30 could benefit the east-central Ohio region as follows:

1. Establish a much needed corridor through Ohio stretching from the borders of West Virginia to Indiana and will be critically important to meeting statewide transit needs to help make Ohio a national transit leader;
2. Give companies better access to Western Pennsylvania, including markets in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and will increase economic activity;
3. Enhance maritime freight activity by providing better access to the Wellsville Port on the Ohio River and accordingly connecting businesses with the national maritime freight corridor;
4. Create a freight corridor that will enhance freight movement and will more efficiently and effectively use intermodal rail facilities to increase freight performance;
5. Provide easy access to commercial air service to the Pittsburgh International Airport and the Akron-Canton Airport and will give passengers and freight greater ingress and egress to the surrounding region;
6. Address the growing congestion on the current two-land highway that slows freight traffic and is a safety risk for both private passenger and commercial vehicles;
7. Serve the additional truck traffic that is predicted to increase by 67% by 2040; and
8. Address the increased demands of Ohio's expanding oil and gas industry and help to maximize the efficiency and competitiveness of the businesses participating in the oil and gas industry.

**WHEREAS**, the passage of this resolution does not commit the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners into entering a cooperative agreement with other counties for the purpose of creating a regional transportation improvement project to complete transportation improvements.

**WHEREAS**, the Tuscarawas County Board of Commissioners believes that further study, as to the benefits and /or detriments to the counties indirectly impacted by such an improvement project, needs to be completed prior to potentially joining and participating in this regional transportation improvement project.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Tuscarawas County, Ohio, that the Board hereby adopts this Resolution in support of exploring the options for joining with another county or counties for the purpose of participating in a regional transportation improvement project to help facilitate improvements to U.S. Route 30.

**DISCUSSION:** Commissioner Abbuhl stated that this resolution does not commit Tuscarawas County to any financial obligation. The Commissioners are only lending support to the other counties. Commissioner Metzger discussed that is more than just Tuscarawas County involved. Stark, Columbiana, Carrol, and Wayne counties are also being included in the exploration of the regional transportation improvement project of U.S. Rt. 30. Commissioner Metzger adjusted the initial resolution presented (Stark County Resolution) in such a way that it does not commit Tuscarawas County to anything. Tuscarawas County firmly believes there should be a study of the benefits and detriments to counties not directly impacted by US 30. The counties directly impacted are Columbiana, Stark and Wayne. Commissioner Everett stated there is not a cost and a good idea to sit down and listen to options and proposals. Commissioner Everett thanked Commissioner Metzger for adjusting the resolution to include the benefits of east-central Ohio region as opposed to an individual county.


