RESOLUTION (1114-2015) CSEA LEASE AGREEMENT

It was moved by Commissioner Metzger, seconded by Commissioner Abbuhl, to approve the following:

LEASE AGREEMENT

This lease agreement is made between the Tuscarawas County Commissioners of 125 East High Avenue, City of New Philadelphia, State of Ohio, ("LESSOR"), and the Tuscarawas County Child Support Enforcement Agency of 154 Second Street NE, City of New Philadelphia, State of Ohio, ("LESSEE").

**SECTION ONE
DESCRIPTION OF LEASED PREMISES**

LESSOR leases to LESSEE and LESSEE leases from LESSOR the building presently known as the Child Support Enforcement Agency Building, located at 154 Second Street NE, New Philadelphia, Ohio ("the premises"). In addition, LESSOR shall provide and maintenance seventeen (17) adjacent designated parking spaces and other adequate parking facilities within a reasonable distance of the premises for the use of the employees of the LESSEE. The premises shall not include the office suite known as 152 2nd St. N.E., New Philadelphia, Ohio, occupied by the Tuscarawas County Child Advocacy Center.

**SECTION TWO
TERM**

The premises is leased for a term of Sixty (60) months, commencing on January 1, 2016, and to end on December 31, 2020, or on such earlier date as this lease agreement may be terminated as provided below.

**SECTION THREE
RENEWAL OF LEASE**

The lease shall automatically be renewed one (1) time for an identical five (5) year term as provided in the lease agreement. No written notice of intention to renew need be furnished prior to the expiration of this lease agreement. The renewal shall be subject to all terms and conditions as provided in this lease agreement. Additional renewals thereafter shall be subject to negotiations and further agreement of the parties.

**SECTION FOUR
RENT**

The total yearly rent in the sum of Twenty Thousand Seven Hundred and Twelve Dollars 00/100 (\$20,712.00), which sum is payable in the first quarter of each year during that term.

**SECTION FIVE
USE AND OCCUPANCY**

LESSEE shall use and occupy the premises as offices for the Tuscarawas County Child Support Enforcement Agency and for no other purposes. LESSOR represents that the premises may lawfully be used for such purpose.

**SECTION SIX
CARE AND REPAIR OF PREMISES**

- A. LESSEE shall commit no act of waste and shall take good care of the premises and the fixtures and appurtenances on the premises, and shall, in the use and occupancy of the premises, conform to all laws, order, and regulations of the federal, state, and municipal governments or any of their departments.
- B. LESSEE shall make and pay for all alterations to the premises, but not including structural repairs. All improvements made by LESSEE to the premises that are so attached to the premises that they cannot be removed without material injury to the premises shall become the property of the LESSOR on installation/alteration. LESSEE shall neither make nor be responsible for payment for any structural repairs to include heating, cooling, roof, etc.
- C. Not later than the last day of the term of this agreement, LESSEE shall, at LESSEE'S expense remove all of the LESSEE'S personal property and those improvements made by the LESSEE that have not become the property of the LESSOR, including trade fixtures, cabinet work, movable paneling, partitions, and the like; repair all injury done by or in connection with the installation or removal of the property and improvements; and surrender the premises in as good condition as they were at the beginning of the term, reasonable wear and damage by fire, the elements, casualty, or other cause excepted.
- D. All property of the LESSEE remaining on the premises after the last day of the term of this lease agreement shall be conclusively deemed abandoned and may be removed by LESSOR.
- E. LESSOR shall be responsible for maintenance of all exterior portions of the leased premises. LESSEE shall be responsible for lawn care and landscaping maintenance. The current agreement allows for the LESSOR to provide these services with reimbursement from the LESSEE through the Indirect Cost Allocation Program.

**SECTION SEVEN
ALTERATIONS, ADDITIONS, OR IMPROVEMENTS**

LESSEE shall not, without first obtaining the written consent of LESSOR, make any alterations, additions, or improvements in, to or about the premises.

**SECTION EIGHT
PROHIBITION AGAINST ACTIVITIES THAT
INCREASE FIRE INSURANCE RATES**

LESSEE shall not do or suffer anything to be done on the premises that will cause an increase in the rate of fire insurance on the building in which the premises are located.

**SECTION NINE
ACCUMULATION OF WASTE OR REFUSE MATTER**

LESSEE shall not permit the accumulation of waste or refuse matter on the premises or anywhere in or near the building in which the premises is located. LESSEE shall provide regular waste and refuse removal service for the premises.

**SECTION TEN
COMPLIANCE WITH RULES AND REGULATIONS**

LESSEE shall observe and comply with the rules and regulations set forth below, which are made part of this lease agreement, and with such further reasonable rules and regulations as LESSOR may prescribe, on written notice to LESSEE, for the safety, care, cleanliness of the premises and the building in which the premises are located and the comfort, quiet enjoyment, and convenience of other occupants of the building in which the premises are located.

**SECTION ELEVEN
SNOW REMOVAL**

LESSOR shall provide snow removal services for removal of all snow from the parking lot in the rear of the building. The LESSOR shall provide, when possible, removal of all snow from the sidewalks surrounding the building, when plowing the rear parking lot. LESSEE shall be responsible for snow removal at entryways. The current agreement allows for the LESSOR to provide these services with reimbursement from the LESSEE through the Indirect Cost Allocation Program.

**SECTION TWELVE
HEAT**

LESSEE agrees to furnish and pay for heat on business days adequate and reasonable for the premises, or when and as needed. LESSEE acknowledges that it has entered into an agreement to allocate all utility bills, between it and the Tuscarawas County Advocacy Center.

**SECTION THIRTEEN
WATER**

LESSEE agrees to furnish and pay for hot and cold water for lavatory and other purposes.

**SECTION FOURTEEN
CLEANING SERVICES**

As the premises are used exclusively as offices for the CSEA, LESSEE agrees to furnish and pay for cleaning services customary in the building in which the premises are located. The current agreement allows for the LESSOR to provide these services with reimbursement from the LESSEE through the Indirect Cost Allocation Program.

**SECTION FIFTEEN
AIR CONDITIONING**

LESSEE agrees to provide, furnish, pay for and maintain air conditioning on the premises on business days, or when and as needed. LESSEE agrees to furnish and pay for electricity on business days adequate and reasonable for the premises, or when and as needed. LESSEE acknowledges that it has entered into an agreement to allocate all utility bills, including electric bills, between it and the Tuscarawas County Child Advocacy Center.

**SECTION SIXTEEN
ELECTRICITY**

LESSEE agrees to furnish and pay for electricity for usual office requirements; however LESSEE shall not interfere with the reasonable use of such installations by other tenants in the building in which the premises is located. LESSEE agrees to furnish and pay for electricity on business days adequate and reasonable for the premises, or when and as needed. LESSEE acknowledges that it has entered into an agreement to allocate all utility bills, including electric bills, between it and the Tuscarawas County Child Advocacy Center.

**SECTION SEVENTEEN
DAMAGES TO BUILDING**

In any case in which the use of the premises is affected by any damage to the building in which the premises are located, there shall be either an abatement or an equitable reduction in rent depending on the period for which and the extent to which the premises are not reasonably usable for the purpose for which they are leased under this agreement.

**SECTION EIGHTEEN
WAIVERS OF SUBROGATION**

In spite of provisions of Section Six of this lease agreement, in the event of loss or damage to the building in which the premises located, or the premises, or any contents located in or on the premises, each party shall look first to any insurance in its favor before making any claim against the other party. To the extent possible without additional cost, each party shall obtain, for each policy of insurance, provisions permitting waiver of any claim against the other party for loss or damage within the scope of the insurance. Each party, to the extent permitted, for itself and its insurers waives all insured claims against the other party.

**SECTION NINETEEN
EFFECT OF FAILURE TO INSIST ON
STRICT COMPLIANCE WITH CONDITIONS**

The failure of either party to insist on strict performance of any covenant or condition of this lease agreement, or to exercise any option contained in this lease agreement, shall not be construed as a waiver of such covenant, condition, or option in any other instance.

**SECTION TWENTY
SUBORDINATION OF LEASE AGREEMENT**

This lease agreement shall be subject and subordinate to all underlying lease agreements and to mortgages and trust deeds that may now or hereafter affect such lease agreements or the real property of which the premises form a part, and also to all agreements and the mortgages and trust deeds. Although no instrument or act on the part of the LESSEE shall be necessary to effectuate such subordination, LESSEE will, nevertheless, execute and deliver such further instruments confirming such subordination of this lease agreement as may be desired by the holders of the mortgages and trust deeds or by any of the LESSORS under such underlying lease agreements. LESSEE appoints LESSOR attorney-in-fact, irrevocably, to execute and deliver any such instrument for LESSEE.

**SECTION TWENTY-ONE
NOTICES**

Any notice by either party to the other shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given only if delivered or sent by registered or certified mail in an addressed postpaid envelope. If the notice is addressed to LESSEE, it shall be addressed to LESSEE at the premises. If the notice is addressed to the LESSOR, it shall be addressed to LESSOR at LESSOR'S address as set forth above. Notice shall be deemed to have been duly given if delivered personally, on delivery, and if mailed on the 14th day after the mailing notice.

**SECTION TWENTY-TWO
LESSOR'S RIGHT TO INSPECTION, REPAIR
AND MAINTENANCE**

LESSOR may enter the premises at any reasonable time, on adequate notice to LESSEE (except that no notice need be given in case of emergency) for the purpose of inspection or making of such repairs, replacements, or additions in, to, on and about the premises or the building in which the premises are located, as LESSOR deems necessary or desirable. LESSEE shall have no claim or cause of action against the LESSOR by reason of such entry except as provided in Section Twenty-Three of this lease agreement.

**SECTION TWENTY-THREE
INTERRUPTION OF SERVICES OR USE**

Interruption or curtailment of any service maintained in the building in which the premises are located, if caused by strikes, mechanical difficulties, or any causes beyond LESSOR'S control whether similar or dissimilar to those enumerated, shall not entitle LESSEE to any claim against LESSOR or to any abatement in rent, and shall not constitute constructive or partial eviction, unless LESSOR fails to take such measures as may be reasonable under the circumstances to restore the service without undue delay. If the premises are rendered untenable in whole or part for a period in excess of thirty (30) business days by making of repairs, replacements, or additions, other than those made with LESSEE'S consent, there shall be a proportionate abatement of rent during the period of such untenability.

**SECTION TWENTY-FOUR
CONDITIONS OF LESSOR'S LIABILITY**

LESSEE shall not be entitled to claim a constructive eviction from the premises unless LESSEE shall first notify LESSOR in writing of the condition or conditions giving rise to such eviction, and, if the complaints be justified, unless LESSOR shall have failed within a reasonable time of receipt of the notice to remedy such conditions.

**SECTION TWENTY-FIVE
ENTIRE AGREEMENT**

This lease agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties. Any prior understanding or representation of any kind preceding the date of this lease agreement shall not be binding upon either party except to the extent incorporated in this lease agreement.

**SECTION TWENTY-SIX
MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT**

Any modifications of this lease agreement or additional obligation assumed by either party in connection with this agreement shall be binding only if evidenced in a writing signed by each party or an authorized representative of each party.

**SECTION TWENTY-SEVEN
QUIET ENJOYMENT**

LESSOR covenants that if, and so long as, LESSEE pays the rent, and any additional rent is provided, and performs the covenants of this lease agreement, LESSEE shall peaceably and quietly have, hold, and enjoy the premises of the term mentioned, subject to the provisions of this lease agreement.

**SECTION TWENTY-EIGHT
PARAGRAPH HEADINGS**

The title to the paragraphs of this lease agreement are solely for the convenience of the parties and shall not be used to explain, modify, simplify, or aid in the interpretation of the provisions of this lease agreement.

**SECTION TWENTY-NINE
BINDING EFFECT OF SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS**

The provisions of this lease agreement shall apply to, bind, and inure to the benefit of the LESSOR and LESSEE, and their respective heirs, successors, legal representatives, and assigns. It is understood that the term LESSOR as used in this lease means only the owner, a mortgagee in possession, or a term LESSEE of the building in which the premises are located, so that in the event of any sale of the building or of any lease of the building, or if mortgagee shall take possession of the premises, LESSOR named shall be entirely freed and relieved of all covenants and obligations of LESSOR subsequently accruing under the lease agreement. It shall be deemed without further agreement that the

purchaser, the term LESSEE of the building or the mortgagee in possession has assumed and agreed to carry out any and all covenants and obligations of LESSOR under this agreement.

**SECTION THIRTY
GOVERNING LAW**







Commissioner Everett called the meeting out of recess and back into Regular Session at 9:30 a.m. for purpose of Public Hearing Subdivision Regulations Changes.

PUBLIC HEARING THURSDAY DECEMBER 17, 2015 PROPOSED CHANGES COUNTY'S SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS (LOT SIZE) 1:30 p.m.

Commissioner Everett stated the purpose of the hearing was for the proposed changes to the county's subdivision regulations on lot size. The regulations were recommended and approved by the Tuscarawas County Regional Planning Commission (TCRPC) on October 13, 2015. Jill Lengler, Director of Tuscarawas County Regional Planning presented information to the public regarding the changes. Ms. Lengler explained the TCRPC already had a public hearing and voted to approve the changes on October 13, 2015. The changes come about due to the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) changes on lot sewage regulations (Ohio Administrative Code (3701-29). The TCRPC reviewed the current .97 (error .92) acres minimum lot size for un-sewered areas that has been in place for over 20 years. With the new ODH regulations the TCRPC didn't feel the current lot size was large enough to put new septic systems on lots. It will not affect any recorded lots. The new lot size voted on and approved is from .92 to 1.5 acres for a single family home, from 1.3 to 2.0 acres for a two family home and a triple family home or larger cannot get septic approval locally and must go through the Ohio EPA for approval since local regulations do not include the larger homes. Any lot split application under two acres will be required to have attached the Tuscarawas County General Health Districts completed sewage treatment system site review. If over two acres the Tuscarawas County Health Department (TCHD) will be required to sign the back of the lot split form as it currently does. The Ohio Revised Code states any action taken upon by Regional Planning also has to be adopted by the Board of County Commissioners. That is the purpose of this hearing. Ms. Lengler asked for any input from the TCHD representatives Mike Chek and Zach Phillips regarding septic rules.

Commissioner Abbuhl questioned if current homes would be affected. Ms. Lengler explained any current deeded homes would not be. Commissioner Abbuhl then asked about resale of a home and if the new acreage is needed. Ms. Lengler said it is a lot of record and it doesn't matter. Commissioner Abbuhl asked what would happen if the possibility arose that the new homeowner would need to replace the septic system. Ms. Lengler responded that they would be able to put a new septic system in, but the new system might be able to fit on the lot. Commissioner Everett felt Mr. Chek or Mr. Phillips from the TCHD should answer because there is the point of inspection by the Health Department. She felt it is key for people to understand that if you own a lot and you want to put a system on it and it's less than the requirement there is a process to go through. Mr. Chek from the TCHD then explained as long as the Point of Sale has passed inspection it is grandfathered in. If vacant lots are currently in an allotment and the lots already split into .92 and deeded, the TCHD will still have to figure something out. If there is a gas line, a ravine or something similar that it is going to make it more challenging and it may be out of the TCHD range because the state has changed all the rules and the options available to the TCHD. They may have to look into getting an engineered system. Commissioner Abbuhl asked if someone has a minimum lot right now, sold the property, and the new owners want to put a new septic in on the same property where the current septic exists what happens? Mr. Chek explained it might not be the same system that was there because the state has deemed some systems unacceptable. Ms. Lengler explained that is one reason why the TCRPC is making the change to a bigger lot size. You would be paying more money for land, but better than spending money on an expensive septic system. There are lots right now that are 1.5 acres and are not suitable for a septic system because of soil, slope, etc. Ms. Lengler believes Stark County has a minimum of two acres. Mr. Chek believes either Stark or Summit has a five acre

minimum. Ms. Lengler said they did not want to go that big because it cuts down on the amount of people being able to acquire land/property. By going with the 1.5 it still allows people to get septic systems on it. Mr. Chek added it also allows for a reserve area. Every septic system will fail over time, so there needs to be a suitable area to put in a replacement system. Commissioner Abbuhl asked if the current .92 acre requirement does not change could someone put a new septic system in if it meets the soil qualifications even with the changes at the state level. Mr. Chek responded they could, but there would be obstacles with the reduction in size and types of systems that the TCHD is authorized to approve. It is physically not possible to get a new system on a lot size of .92 acres. It would require an engineer to design a system and get approval of that system before installing. The state of Ohio gives a limited number of options for septic systems. The general discussion was the size of the lot .92 acres opposed to the 1.5 acres. The larger lot size gives more flexibility for new septic systems to be installed with enough space. If it does not change, it will take an engineered system approved by the TCHD to be installed which could be very costly. Mr. Chek explained the two major types of septic systems in Tuscarawas County that are no longer allowed to be installed are the transportation mound system (where you have a large mounds with pipes sticking out with aerators and usually pine trees) and the dry well leach wells. The entire Brightwood community at the east end of New Philadelphia is leach wells. There will be issues on what to do when a replacement system is necessary. Mr. Chek said they have been in contact with the state, but haven't received any cooperation from them on what to do and clarification on this issue. Ms. Lengler explained this change is for residential home only. There have been several lots splits that are contiguous and will be stamped and approved as contiguous. The change only applies to building sites. Commissioner Everett asked Mike Jones, Director/Engineer Tuscarawas County Water & Sewer and a member of the Tuscarawas County Regional Planning Committee if he had any input on this subject. Mr. Jones said he is fully in support of the change for reasons stated previously. Mr. Jones and Commissioner Everett agree it environmentally makes sense.

Commissioner Abbuhl asked Mr. Chek if he had an idea of the cost of a standard septic system and an engineered system. Mr. Chek said he could only speculate anywhere from \$8000.00 to \$15,000.00 for a standard system. The costs would vary depending on materials used. The engineered system is predicted to be somewhat higher. The new technology and material costs being used for the engineered systems are not certain because the installers are not familiar with these systems.

Commissioner Metzger asked Ms. Lengler about section 303 Development Standards Lot Size. The minimum lot size of any minor subdivision where there is no public sewers shall be as shown in the Residential Lot Minimums Chart in the Appendix or as required by township zoning and/or the Tuscarawas General Health District, whichever is greater. Any lot split 2 acres or under in size (3 acres for 2 family unit), which is for any use that is likely to have an on lot sewage treatment system, and where there is no public sewer, will require a Sewage Treatment System Site Review from the Tuscarawas County General Health District to be attached to the lot split application. His question is would the Regional Planning lot size supersede township zoning. Ms. Lengler said whichever is stricter. Commissioner Metzger asked Ms. Lengler if it was legally permitted to do that because zoning is voted in by the electorate. Ms. Lengler said it was her understanding it superseded the zoning. Commissioner Metzger requested Ms. Lengler to verify which supersedes. He also questioned if the Township Association has stated their position on the subdivision regulations. Ms. Lengler stated she did not, however several township trustees are on the Regional Planning Board and voted for the changes and all have received the information regarding the changes. She has not heard of any opposition.

PUBLIC INPUT:

Mr. Rod Endsley questioned the cost associated with the engineering of a septic system. He understands the cost could vary due to slope, water level, soil, etc. He didn't believe a possible vote should take place today without knowing these costs. His concern is if the costs are too high you could shut down rural housing. Commissioner Everett questioned if there was a way to find out the costs and asked Mr. Jones if he had an idea. He responded he did not because he has not worked on a residential system. Commissioner Everett believes the costs should be looked into and Mr. Chek stated they only deal with a couple locally and a couple in Stark County so they would be able to possibly provide info. Ms. Lengler feels it will be at least a year until they have a grasp on costs and start installing systems. Mr. Chek recommended going on the TCHD website and find registered installers and speak with them to possibly find an estimated cost. Mr. Endsley asked Mr. Chek how many of the engineered systems they have had, not because of regulations, but due to other circumstances. Mr. Chek responded a handful a year, but the new rules are much more restrictive and they took away the ability to be more creative to move things around. The regulations are a "cookie cutter" now. He said the TCHD hands are tied. Anything conventional we do not have a choice. Ms. Lengler recommended before you buy a lot, you should go through a POS (point of sale) process with the TCHD. Mr. Chek said that the POS process is for pre-existing parcels. If it is a vacant lot, it is a different story, he said. Soil sampling, power lines, high walls, gas lines – all are taken into consideration if it is a vacant lot. Commissioner Abbuhl stated that you do not have to have the Health Department sign off to sell a vacant lot, but it would be smart to contact the TCHD.

Commissioner Metzger asked Ms. Lengler if there is a way research can be done to obtain data, not necessarily specific because circumstances change. Commissioner Metzger said he agrees with Mr. Endsley that we do not want to prevent development in our rural areas. Ms. Lengler said that is why they went with 1.5 acres.

Mary Jo Monte from Dover Township stated whether it is .92 acre, or 1.5 acres, if the septic system fails, you have to add on more land or use the more expensive engineered systems. She said property owners then may be forced to move out because they cannot afford it. Commissioner Everett said that a policy online for residents to obtain information about the various septic situations would be beneficial. Zach Phillips from the TCHD said he is currently working on that and believes it would be beneficial, too. Mr. Chek stated that the rules are new to their staff, too. They were presented to the TCHD in November 2014 and take effect the first of 2016, so there was plenty of time, but they are still trying to get questions answered from the Ohio Department of Health. They are being forced to comply with the regulations, but many questions are left unanswered at the state level.

Commissioner Everett asked Mr. Phillips about the effects of water contamination. Mr. Phillips stated that wells can be very shallow and located next to leach wells, which can cause contamination. The state's new rules are not designed to get the sewage out, but to treat it. Going forward, residents are going to be responsible for their own septic system. Clayton Weller of Sugarcreek is concerned about adding to your lot size and is it justifiable for that size lot. Ms. Lengler explained that you do not need to add anything to an existing lot. It is strictly if you are splitting land off. Bob Allison questioned if the 1.5 acres is part of a floodplain, would that be OK for a septic system. Ms. Lengler explained that the Tuscarawas County floodplain regulations state that if you have property in a floodplain, you cannot put a well or septic system in the floodplain. Mr. Chek said that if you are planning on building in a floodplain, the septic system will need to be located at a higher elevation, requiring pumps and other additional cost.
