**PY-2015 CD ALLOCATION GRANT &  
CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT**

**MINUTES OF PUBLIC HEARING #2  
May 28, 2015**

The public hearing began at promptly 9:30 a.m. in the William E. Winters Conference Room, 125 East High Ave., New Philadelphia OH 44663. Commissioner Belle Everett opened the public hearing and turned it over to Scott S. Reynolds, Director of the Tuscarawas County Office of Community & Economic Development (OCED). Mr. Reynolds read through the advertisement that was published on May 18, 2015 in the Times Reporter for Public Hearing #2. The funded activities were chosen from among all the applications that were submitted at the PY-2015 Public Hearing #1, which was held on April 20, 2015.

Mr. Reynolds continued on with the second portion of the display ad to explain the Critical Infrastructure Grant that we will also be applying for on behalf of Joe Bachman, Tuscarawas County Engineer. Mr. Reynolds stated that we were unsuccessful in receiving funding for this project last year. Commissioner Abbuhl mentioned that we did not have knowledge of the State's points system when applying for this grant last year. This year that information is made known and we have made a few adjustments to the project in hopes of receiving the funds this year.

There was a brief discussion during which Commissioner Abbuhl mentioned that he appreciated the political subdivisions which did apply for funding this year and encouraged those not chosen for funding to keep applying. It was also mentioned that applications/requests for funding almost always exceed available funds. Commissioners Abbuhl, Everett and Mr. Reynolds all agreed that we had many good applications this year and would have liked to fund more of them if additional funding had been available to do so. They also mentioned that everyone concerned tried to be as fair and equitable with the distribution of funding as they could.

Mr. Reynolds then read the names from the Sign-In Sheet and each person present had an opportunity to comment on the selected projects and the program as a whole. Commissioner Abbuhl reiterated the fact that all submitted projects are good projects, however funds are limited so we try to do the best we can to distribute funds evenly. Commissioner Everett said that she spoke with two of the Warren Township Trustees and they had expressed their concerns that Adams Road; which is the project they had submitted; would most likely have to be ground up and made gravel due to the severity of the roads deterioration. Commissioner Metzger did not have any questions or comments. There were no objections or comments from those in attendance.

Mr. Reynolds turned the meeting back over to Commissioner Everett to pass both Resolutions; PY-2015 CD Allocation Grand and PY-2015 Critical Infrastructure Grant; authorizing the Office of Community and Economic Development to file the Grant Application's with the State.
