**RESOLUTION (458-2016) MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING TUSCARAWAS COUNTY  
COMMISSIONERS-TUSCARAWAS COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT**

It was moved by Commissioner Everett, seconded by Commissioner Abbuhl, to approve and accept the Memorandum of Understanding between the Tuscarawas County Commissioners and the Tuscarawas County Health Department for allocation of funds to be received from the Ohio Department of Health in relationship to TB funding.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

This Memorandum of Understanding is made between the Board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners and the Tuscarawas County Health Department.

1. Through a April 29, 2016, email communication, Katie Seward, Tuscarawas County Health Commissioners, has advised the Board of Commissioners on potential additional funding via The Center For Disease Control TB Cooperative Agreement, noting that:

Historically, TB funds received through the CDC, TB Cooperative Agreement have been distributed to counties with consistently high TB morbidity- Cuyahoga, Franklin, Hamilton, Montgomery, and in the early 2000s, Lucas and Summit counties.

Over the years, TB morbidity has declined throughout the state, including the metro areas. For the last five years, roughly half of all Ohio TB cases were reported in random counties.

- Those counties typically do not have categorical TB dollars in local budgets
- Most counties do not maintain a dedicated TB control unit
- Staff turnover (and infrequent TB) decreased TB expertise
- Local TB programs have stated they lack the resources to perform basic public health TB investigation and case management. This is supported by
  - Late TB diagnosis; six TB deaths in 2014
  - Transmission in Ohio communities; genotype match for cases identified months-year apart
- Drug resistant TB cases are increasing in Ohio, including primary drug resistance (cases previously pan-susceptible)

Starting in 2016, all counties will be eligible to receive funds to offset the cost of public health activities associated with cases that complete an approved course of treatment. Eligibility criteria have been established for counties to receive funds, and are based upon standards of care set forth in the American Thoracic Society and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidance documents, referenced in ORC/OAC. That means medical and public health case management standards must be met, as evidence by the following:

- Drug regimen must be appropriate for susceptibility pattern
- Directly observed therapy must be performed and documented
  - DOT doses will be counted according to treatment guidelines
- HIV status should be documented for every TB patient
- Sputum culture conversation must be documented with 60 days of treatment initiation- ODH Lab will provide testing at no cost to designated TB control units
- Transfer cases from other jurisdictions must receive 80% of their care in a county to claim funding

- Medically complex case-patients will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis if treatment extends for more than one year, payment may occur in consecutive years

During January-February each year, ODH, in collaboration with county TB control units, will reconcile data contained in the Ohio Disease Reporting System for cases that completed treatment in the previous year.

2. In April or May of 2016, State authorities will issue letters defining the number of cases of completed TB treatment meeting various criteria, which will be sent to the director of the TB Control Unit and the respective Board of County Commissioners. Included within the letter will be a contract validating the completeness and accuracy of the county data. Upon concurrence of the county officials, the contract will be signed and returned to the Ohio Department of Health within two (2) weeks of receipt. Thereafter, funds will be disbursed to the various counties during the first quarter of the State fiscal year.
3. The Board of County Commissioners and Tuscarawas County Health District desire, in advance, to allocate the respective funds to be received. Specifically, any funds received from the Ohio Department of Health will be shared fifty percent (50%) to be disbursed to the Board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners and the remaining fifty percent (50%) to the Tuscarawas County Health Department.

**DISCUSSION:** Commissioner Abbuhl clarified that in the resolution where it refers to the TB Control Unit, which is the Tuscarawas County Health Department. Commissioner Metzger said he spoke with

Katie Seward, Tuscarawas County Health Commissioner and she is fine with the memorandum of understanding.

**RESOLUTION (459-2016) SUPPORT STEPPING UP EFFORT-TO REDUCE NUMBER OF PEOPLE WITH MENTAL ILLNESSES & CO-CURRING SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS IN JAIL**

It was moved by Commissioner Abbuhl, seconded by Commissioner Everett, to support the following:

**WHEREAS**, counties routinely provide treatment services to the estimated 2 million people with serious mental illnesses booked into jail each year;

**WHEREAS**, almost three-quarters of adults with serious mental illnesses in jails have co-occurring substance use disorders;

**WHEREAS**, county jails spend significantly more on adults who require interventions compared to those without these treatment needs;

**WHEREAS**, without the appropriate treatment and services, people with mental illnesses and co-occurring substance use disorders continue to cycle through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes for these individuals and their families;

**WHEREAS**, Tuscarawas County, and all counties take pride in their responsibility to protect and enhance the health, welfare, and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways;

**WHEREAS**, Tuscarawas County has in place a Sequential Intercept Mapping Plan developed through the efforts of the Alcohol, Drug Addiction, and Mental Health Services Board of Tuscarawas and Carroll Counties in collaboration with a team of local law enforcement, legal, mental health, medical and addiction treatment professionals, concerned citizens and service consumers. Developed under the guidance of the Ohio Criminal Justice Coordinating Center of Excellence, this plan resulted in a week-long Crisis Intervention Team training for law enforcement officers in February, 2016;

**WHEREAS**, Tuscarawas County currently has two specialized court dockets which take a holistic approach to treating offenders with substance abuse and co-occurring mental health issues: the Tuscarawas County Court of Common Pleas COBRA Court and the New Philadelphia Municipal Recovery Court;

**WHEREAS**, through Stepping Up, the National Association of Counties, the Council of State Governments Justice Center, and the American Psychiatric Association Foundation are encouraging public, private, and nonprofit partners to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in jails; and,

**WHEREAS**, through Stepping Up efforts in Ohio, technical assistance and resource opportunities may be available to communities that wish to establish or expand local collaboration and capacity as it relates to individuals with mental illness and substance use disorders who are justice involved.

**NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, THAT we, the Tuscarawas County Commissioners**, do hereby sign on to the Call to Action to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses and co-occurring substance use disorders in our county jail, commit to sharing lessons learned with other counties in our state and across the country to support a national initiative and encourage all county officials, employees, and residents to participate in Stepping Up. We resolve to utilize the comprehensive resources available through Stepping Up to:

- Continue to draw on a diverse team of leaders and decision makers from multiple agencies committed to examine options for improvement;
- Continue to collect and review prevalence numbers and assess individuals' needs to better identify adults entering jails with behavioral health conditions and their recidivism risk, and use that baseline information to guide decision making at the system, program, and case levels;
- Continue to examine treatment and service capacity to determine which programs and services are available in the county for people with mental illnesses and co-occurring substance use disorders, and identify state and local policy and funding barriers to minimizing contact with the justice system and providing treatment and supports in the community;

- Further develop our plan with measurable outcomes that draws on the jail assessment and prevalence data and the examination of available treatment and service capacity, while considering identified barriers;
- Continue to implement research-based approaches that advance the plan; and
- Utilize a process to track progress using data and information systems, and to report on successes.

**DISCUSSION:** Commissioner Abbuhl noted Tuscarawas County was on the forefront of this initiative and already has a plan in place. Law enforcement, Alcohol Drug and Mental Health Services, and other mental health agencies met to create a plan to assist law enforcement with the drug and mental health issues of citizens that they deal with. In February 2016 the plan that was created resulted in a week long crises intervention team training for law enforcement officers. Commissioner Everett said even though we are ahead of the game we still need to implement Project DAWN (Deaths Avoided With Naloxone). Vickie Ionno, New Philadelphia Health Commissioner will be getting the Project Dawn Kits, Naloxone (also known as Narcan) is a medication that can reverse an overdose caused by an opioid drug (heroin or prescription pain medications). Commissioner Everett recently attended the New Philadelphia Municipal Recovery Court. Also in attendance were Eastern Ohio Regional Liaison for Governor Kasich, Tim Ross; Jennifer Kiko, Field Representative for Congressman Bob Gibbs and a representative from Senator Rob Portman's office. Commissioner Everett would encourage anyone to walk in on a Wednesday at 11:00 am and listen to the stories and the conversations between Municipal Court Judge Von Allman and those before her. The mission of the court is to improve the overall quality of life in our community by providing a Court-supervised program for opiate dependent defendants. The program is intended to hold individuals accountable to their families and society, restore families, enhance public safety by reducing criminal and drug related activity, reduce costs to the taxpayers, and provide an opportunity for drug dependent individuals to become sober, positive, and contributing members of our community. Commissioner Everett said Judge Von Allman has been very proactive in dealing with drug addiction issues and appreciates all the work local judges are doing and how they are working cooperatively.
