

**Discussion:** Joy Padgett representing the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Environmental & Financial Assistance, Office of Outreach and Customer Support discussed the many programs OEPA has to offer. Ms. Padgett discussed and distributed a resource guide along with brochures regarding Onsite Pollution Prevention Assistance, Asbestos Check Before You Wreck, Recycling & Litter Prevention Grants and Encouraging Environmental Excellence. She gave a history of Director Craig Butler's work experience at every level as he started as an intern, held various administrative positions and is now director. The OEPA has revolving loan funds for water and sewer projects and has the lowest interest rates compared to other funders. If there is a project and some funding is in place but there is not all funding in place, they can assist to find other funding. (OWDA website has a listing of the meetings every other month for assistance from potential funders.) The OEPA does not have grants but they do have a principle forgiveness program where some communities have been granted 100% forgiveness. The OEPA is trying to make it easier for communities to put the projects together. Some programs are for local communities, governments, non-profits, civic organizations, high schools, churches, etc. Ms. Padgett can be reached at (614)644-3783 for clarification on the various programs and requirements. Ms. Padgett also stressed the importance of acquiring an Asbestos removal permit prior to beginning a demolition project; call their confidential hotline for free assistance (800)329-7518. The OEPA is available to assist businesses with their permitting process, regulation compliance, remediation, as well as diverting waste from one company to be utilized by another company.

The Commissioners thanked Ms. Padgett for the presentation.
