TUSCARAWAS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

**NON-EMERGENCY SALES AND USE TAX RENEWAL
FOR A PERIOD OF TEN YEARS**

**A RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE TUSCARAWAS COUNTY
BOARD OF ELECTIONS TO SUBMIT TO THE ELECTORS OF
TUSCARAWAS COUNTY, OHIO, AT THE ELECTION TO BE HELD
ON NOVEMBER 8, 2016, THE RENEWAL OF A COUNTY SALES AND
USE TAX IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE PERCENT FOR A PERIOD OF TEN YEARS**

The Board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners met in regular session on the 28th day of July, 2016, with the following members present: Belle Everett, Kerry Metzger, Chris Abbuhl. Ms. Everett moved the adoption of the following:

Resolution

Whereas, it is the desire of this Board to continue the levying of the following taxes:

1. Permissive sales tax as set forth in R.C. 5739.021;
2. The permissive use tax as set forth in R.C. 5741.021;

Presently levied and set to expire on 12/31/17 under Commissioner's Resolutions number 100-2007 and 028-2007, for the purpose of continuing to provide additional general revenue for the county and paying the costs of enforcing and administering the taxes;

Whereas, pursuant to a Resolution duly adopted by the board of Tuscarawas County Commissioners on June 20, 2016, (581-2016) and as provided for therein, public notice has been published and two public hearings have been held according to the law on the question of the adoption of a Resolution levying via renewal, a County Sales and Use Tax pursuant to R.C. 5739.02 and R.C. 5741.021; and

Whereas, this Board, having heard all interested persons who requested to be heard on such question, determines in the best interest of Tuscarawas County that this Resolution should be adopted.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the Board of County Commissioners of Tuscarawas County:

The Board of Elections of Tuscarawas County, Ohio, is directed to submit the issue of the following sales and use levy to the electors of Tuscarawas County, Ohio, at the election to be held on November 8, 2016.

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of R.C. 5739.021 there is levied, effective January 1, 2018, and for a ten (10) year period of time, a tax at a rate of one percent, upon every retail sale made within Tuscarawas County, except sales of watercraft and outboard motors required to be titled pursuant to R.C. Chapter 1548 and sales of motor vehicles. The tax on every retail sale subject to a tax levied shall be in addition to the tax levied by R.C. 5739.02 and any tax levied pursuant to R.C. 5739.023 or R.C. 5739.026.

Section 2. Pursuant to the provisions of R.C. 5741.021, that there is also levied effective January 1, 2018, and for a ten (10) year period of time, a tax at a rate of one percent, upon the storage, use, or other consumption in the county of motor vehicles, and watercraft and outboard motors required to be titled in the county pursuant to R.C. Chapter 1548, and acquired by a transaction subject to the tax imposed by R.C. 5739.02; Tangible personal property and services subject to the tax levied by this state as provided in R.C. 5741.02, and tangible personal property and services purchased in another county within this state by a transaction subject to the tax imposed by R.C. 5739.02.

The tax levied on the storage, use, or other consumption of tangible personal property and on the benefit of a service realized shall be in addition to the tax levied by R.C. 5741.02 and, except as provided in R.C. 5741.021(D) and any tax levied pursuant to R.C. 5741.022 and 5741.023.

Section 3. The proceeds of the sales and use tax levied shall provide additional revenue for the county's general fund and said tax shall be collected and the expenses of administering it shall be paid as provided by law.

Section 4. The sales and use tax levied shall become effective on the first day of January, 2018, and remain in effect for a period of ten (10) years, terminating on the thirty-first day of December, 2027.

Section 5. Upon passage of this Resolution, the Clerk of the Board shall provide written notice to the Tax Commissioner, Ohio Department of Taxation, that this sales and use tax levy issue is to be submitted to the electors of Tuscarawas County at the November 8, 2016, general election.


Section 6. Upon passage of this Resolution, the Clerk of the Board is directed to certify and deliver a copy of this Resolution to the Tuscarawas County Board of Elections.

Section 7. All Board actions concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were conducted in open meetings.

Section 8. All deliberations of this Board and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

DISCUSSION: Melissa Uebel, Customer Service/Financial Supervisor, Child Support Enforcement Agency read the included communication regarding Child Support Awareness Month August 2016. Ms. Uebel gave the dates of events that will take place during the month of August: Wednesday August 3, 2016 'Wear Green to Work' to Support National Child Support Awareness Month, Friday August 19, 2016 Employee Appreciation Picnic and the month of August Child Support Banners will be displayed throughout the New Philadelphia town square. Ms. Uebel also mentioned they will be joining the Sheriff's Department at the Tuscarawas County Fair (September 19-25, 2016) to provide information on the Early Intervention Program. Commissioner Everett asked Ms. Uebel to explain the Early Intervention program and what the process entails. Ms. Uebel explained the Early Intervention Program is normally for new customers who are coming in for an administrative establishment hearing. This hearing is not the same as a divorce or dissolution hearing where they are given the information through the court system. Ms. Uebel continued to explain the customer will come in for the administrative hearing, at that time the Child Support Enforcement Agency (CSEA) sits down with both parties which can be a caretaker relative, an obligor or an obligee and informs them of what to expect from the program, how things work, how they can make payments, how they receive payments and who their case manager will be. CSEA also assist in setting up the customer's personal web portal. Ms. Uebel said the CSEA's hope is that everyone is more informed when they walk out the door then when they came in. Commissioner Metzger asked Ms. Uebel to tell the CSEA employees that the Board of Commissioners appreciates all the work they do and their work is very valuable, and it is important to make sure kids are being well taken care of.
